### **National Updates**

#### **East Midlands Welcome Hub**

The UK Government have confirmed funding for Year 5 (2025/26) of the HKBNO Welcome Programme. This includes funding for the 12 hubs in the UK including East Midlands, continued funding for Barnardos and On Your Side and support for English Language and Destitution funding for local authorities.

#### **On Your Side – Hate Crime Reporting Service**

The latest On Your Side data report, covering January to December 2024, is now available. It provides an overview of the incidents reported to their service, the communities affected, and where these incidents occurred.

Between January and December, 290 incidents were reported—170 met their verification threshold, with 40 cases passed to the police at the reporter's request. On Your Side's casework advocates supported or referred 115 individuals, with the highest reporting from Hongkongers, Chinese, and Japanese communities. London, North West England, and South East England recorded the most incidents. #### **Barnardo's Wellbeing Support**

Barnardo's continues to provide mental health and wellbeing support for Hongkongers in the UK, building on the offer delivered in Years 1–4 of the Hong Kong BN(O) Programme.

Support includes access to Cantonese-speaking advisors via a helpline and email, remote therapeutic counselling for adults, children and couples, and dedicated youth spaces for young people. Families can also benefit from the Virtual Family Space resource in Cantonese, alongside monthly wellbeing webinars, peer support networks, and volunteering opportunities.

Referrals are welcome from individuals and professionals via phone, email or the online referral form.

#### **Career Coaching for HKBNO in the East Midlands**

Welcome Hub priorities for Year 4 are Employment and Wellbeing for Hong Kong BNO in our region. We are using Hub funding to deliver an employment support and coaching project, led by our experienced HR team.

Last month, we successfully ran a group session in Worksop, followed by a confidencebuilding workshop that was well attended. These sessions have already helped several participants in the area who have accessed ongoing 1-1 coaching support.

#### Small grant funding

We are proud to support the following community-led initiatives through the East Midlands Hong Kong BN(O) Welcome Grant Scheme. Each project is working to enhance the well-being, confidence, and integration of Hong Kong BN(O) individuals and families as they build their lives in the UK.

#### Derby HK CIC – Conversation Club



Derby HK CIC is supporting Hong Kong BN(O) newcomers through a tailored English Conversation Club aimed at developing confidence and everyday communication skills. Based on community feedback, the club is split into two groups: one preparing for the Level B1 English exam, and another offering a relaxed environment to practise conversational English with native speakers.

So far the team at Derby HK CIC have supported 56 hongkongers over 4 separate groups to prepare for their Trinity B1 Speaking and Listening exam in a range of online and inperson classes. There are only a few places left, so if you are interested in participating contact Jeff on 07445511911.

#### Transform Training – Fusion Welcome Project

The Fusion Welcome Project supports the well-being and integration of young Hong Kongers aged 12–18 living in Nottinghamshire. Through weekly youth sessions, residential trips, family days, and arts-based projects, the programme helps teenagers build resilience, new social networks, and a sense of belonging. Staffed by a youth worker with lived experience and supported by trained volunteers, the project creates space for young people to express their emotions, strengthen family ties, and engage with their new community in positive ways. All activities are designed and led in collaboration with participants to promote ownership and empowerment.

The project launched in March with a residential camp at the Hollowford Lindley Centre in Castleton with 20 young hongkongers attended.

The feedback from both young people and their parents was overwhelmingly positive. Many reported that the camp gave their children a rare opportunity to travel outside Nottingham, visit the scenic Peak District, and enjoy nature in a way they had never done before.

The group have also enjoyed a day trip to Matlock Bath, experiencing a scenic train journey to Cromford where they toured the Mason Mills Working Textile Museum.

The group also holds weekly sessions which focus on emotional wellbeing and social development exploring topics such as managing emotions, stress awareness, and emotional literacy – particularly important topics which reflect the challenges many young people face when adjusting to life in the UK.

#### Reach, Derby and Nottingham - Building Bridges

Reach's Building Bridges project offers a comprehensive programme of activities for Hong Kong BN(O) families in Derby and Nottingham, with a potential reach of over 1,000 people. It supports integration through family events, youth sports, arts workshops, intergenerational activities, and well-being sessions.

So far 467 hongkongers have participated in surrounding wellbeing, learning new skills and physical activity such as basketball and badminton. 23 hongkongers also attended an inaugural 'music night' where they enjoyed music and shared their personal journeys and memories with one another. One participant said: "It feels great to relive our youthful days together with a group of fellow Hongkongers in the UK."

By creating inclusive spaces and linking participants to local services, employment pathways, and volunteering opportunities, the project strengthens family relationships, reduces isolation, and fosters lasting community ties.

#### Flying Cows – TESL Volunteering programme

A 16-week programme run by Flying Cows is helping nine hongkongers build skills, gain qualifications, and give back to their communities.

The programme blends formal study with hands-on experience, including a Level 1 Award in Volunteering, a Certificate in TESOL (Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages), and practical volunteering as ESOL classroom assistants. Participants also benefit from tailored support and weekly drop-in sessions.

So far, most of the group have completed their volunteering qualification, with many already contributing to a range of roles including supporting library English conversation groups, hosting social clubs, or volunteering in community centres. These placements are not only giving participants valuable experience but are helping to tackle local needs by fostering integration, improving English skills and building community spirit.

#### Feedback from participants:

One participant said: "I completed the volunteering course and found it very informative and practical. It gave me valuable insights into various charity organisations and how they operate. I especially enjoyed connecting with like-minded classmates during group discussions — we had great conversations and shared encouragement.

"Recently, I began my first volunteering placement at a library's "Places of Welcome" programme. It's been such a meaningful experience engaging with service users and feeling more connected to the community."

Another said: "I'm truly thankful for this programme. It has inspired me to continue volunteering and look for ways to support people who are struggling. Through the English course, I also came to understand that different people have specific needs and face different kinds of difficulties. This helped me become more empathetic and aware of how I can offer meaningful support to others. I hope I can use what I've learned to make a positive difference in the lives of others."



#### Nottingham's 3rd Mahjong Competition

East Midlands Councils was proud to support the 3rd Mahjong Competition in Nottingham, hosted by <u>HK Notts</u>, with funding provided through the HK BN(O) East Midlands Welcome Programme.


### **Updates from across the East Midlands**

## Could you foster a young person seeking safety in the UK?

East Midlands Councils is working with local authorities across the region to help recruit more foster carers for Unaccompanied Asylum-Seeking Children (UASC).

These young people arrive in the UK alone, often after fleeing conflict or persecution. They need stability, support, and a safe home where they can begin to rebuild their lives.

### **Resources**

#### No Recourse to Public Funds (NRPF) Support

When you are granted your BN(O) visa, you will have 'no recourse to public funds' (NRPF). You can apply for a 'change of conditions' if you lose your income, are no longer able to provide food and housing for your family and become destitute. You are also entitled to financial support from your local authority while you wait for this change.

If you successfully apply for a change of conditions whilst you have a BNO visa, it will not impact your ability to apply for settlement through the BNO route after 5 years living in the UK.

#### English Language Support

There is additional funding available for local authorities to provide extra courses in the first 3 years after arrival for Hong Kong BN(O) and this can include courses to help prepare for employment such as IELTS, GCSE English and the B1 course.

At the end of the 3 years, Hong Kong BNO can access mainstream ESOL education but there may be waiting lists at local colleges.

EMC funds 'Begin' to help you find the right course if you live in Nottingham or Nottinghamshire.

If you live in another part of the East Midlands you will need to contact your local college to access support. If you are having any difficulties finding a course, please contact us directly.
